# INDIAN SOCIETY OF AGRICULTURAL STATISTICS

#### FOURTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT, 1960-61

On behalf of the Council of the Society I have great pleasure in presenting to you the report of the Society's activities for the year ending 30th June 1961. The Society's membership during the year was 183 as against 173 in the previous year. Six of the members on roll were honorary members, 7 patrons, 46 life-members and 124 ordinary members.

The membership is drawn from all parts of India as well as from abroad and extends over Agricultural Departments, Institutions and Universities, besides agricultural statisticians and other workers interested in the development of Statistics mainly in relation to agriculture. In addition to its regular membership, the Society is maintaining an additional mailing list of subscribers to the journal which includes important research institutions here and abroad. The number of foreign and Indian subscribers was 136 during the year as compared to 112 in the previous year.

The Society continues to enjoy the privilege of having the President Dr. Rajendra Prasad as the President of the Society from its inception. In spite of his multifarious duties as President of India, he has continued to take keen interest in the activities of the Society and has been a great source of inspiration in advancing the objectives of the Society. As you all know, the President inaugurated the 14th Annual Meeting held at Delhi and for this the Society is very much happy and grateful to the President.

As regards the publication programme of the Society, Volume XII (Nos. 1 and 2) of the Society's journal has since been published. Copies of the volume are placed on the table. Volume XIII of the Society's journal is also expected to be out shortly. With regard to the printing of the journal, the existing arrangements continue. In this connection, the Council of the Society had also to agree, in the absence of any suitable alternatives, to a slight increase in the printing rates, as demanded by the Bangalore Press due to scarcity of papers, etc.

A new item on "News and Notes" has been started in the Society's journal. The type of material which can be published under this head

is indicated in the recent volumes of the journal. All the members are requested to co-operate and send material for "News and Notes" periodically to the Society to make this new venture a success.

It will perhaps not be out of place to repeat that, judging from the requests that are being received for exchange, the Society's Journal continues to draw great appreciation from eminent institutions and research workers in India and abroad. A number of requests for exchange of journals were received by the Council of the Society during the year under report.

The Hindi Supplement continues to be a feature of the journal. This represents an attempt on the part of the Society at precise expression of the scientific discussions of the subject in the national language.

The problem of adequate finances for the printing of the journal continues to receive the attention of the Executive Council of the Society. The cost of printing such a technical journal being high, its publication is sustained mainly through the grants-in-aid received from the Centre, State Governments and other national organisations. During the year under report, grants-in-aid have been received from the Government or Orissa, Government of Uttar Pradesh and Government of Maharashtra. The Society wishes to acknowledge gratefuly the financial assistance received from these Organisations.

Members will recall that with a view to promotion of research in statistics the Society had announced a scheme for the award of prizes for articles of sufficiently high standard and merit published in its journal. Persons for these awards are to be recommended by panels of referees appointed by the Executive Council.

An award of prize of Rs. 500 was made to Dr. K. C. Seal at the 14th Annual Meeting of the Society for his paper in Statistical Genetics entitled "Generalisation of Products Formula" which was published in Volume IX of the Society's journal. No award was made in the three other fields in absence of any recommendation from the referees of papers in those fields. After Volume XI of the Society's Journal was out, panels of referees were selected for assessing the papers printed in Volumes X and XI. Recommendations from three of the four panels of referees have been received and considered by the Council of the Society. The panel on Design and Analysis of Experiments has recommended the name of Dr. K. Kishen and Shri J. N. Srivastava for the award of the prize for their paper entitled "Mathematical Theory of Confounding in Asymmetrical and Symmetrical Factorial Designs"

which was published in Volume XI of the Society's Journal. On the basis of this recommendation the Council of the Society has decided to award the prize of Rs. 500 jointly to Dr. K. Kishen and Shri J. N. Srivastava. This award will be equally shared by them. The awards are proposed to be made at the Inaugural function. The referees who helped the Society in assessing papers in Volumes X and XI for the award were: Dr. R. C. Bose, Prof. O. Kempthorne, Prof. W. G. Cochran, Dr. W. G. Madow, Dr. D. J. Finney, Dr. H. F. Robinson, Prof. H. Cramer, and Dr. R. R. Bahadur. The Society is very much glad to record its grateful thanks to all of them.

The Society's publication Sampling Theory of Surveys with Applications by Dr. P. V. Sukhatme continues to be well received. Most of the stock of the new reprints of the book printed at the Iowa State College Press, Ames., Iowa, U.S.A., has been sold out. The Spanish edition of the book is also in great demand in Latin American countries.

As regards the other activities of the Society, under a scheme of the Society for the encouragement and promotion of research instatistics, an award of research assistance of Rs. 500 was made by the Society to Dr. M. V. Jambunathan (Lecturer of Statistics in Mysore University) for conducting a repeat survey in the village of Daddagani in order to assess the improvement in the sphere of agriculture in the village. Shri K. C. Agarwal, Horticultural Research Assistant at Saharanpur, who is already receiving financial assistance from the Society, is working on uniformity trials and branch sampling relating to horticultural crops. Applications from fresh individuals desirous of such assistance may be addressed to the Secretary in time during the year. Full details of these schemes appear as a special announcement in the journal of the Society.

The 14th Annual Meeting of the Society was held at New Delhi on 9th, 10th and 11th of January, 1961. The session was inaugurated at Vigyan Bhayan by the President of India, Dr. Rajendra Prasad. A speech welcoming the President was delivered by Shri S. K. Patil, Minister for Food and Agriculture, and a welcome address was delivered by Shri V. Shankar, Special Secretary, Ministry of Food and Agriculture, at the inaugural session. A technical address on Agricultural Statistics "Requirements of Users" was delivered by Dr. P. S. Lokanathan, Director-General, National Council of Applied Economic Research.

Two symposia, one on "Fertilizers in Relation to Agricultural Production in India" and the other on "Intensive District Programme", were arranged at the session. The former symposium was presided

over by Shri K. R. Damle, Secretary, Ministry of Food and Agriculture, while the latter was presided over by Shri V. Shankar. The participants in the symposium on "Fertilizer in Relation to Agricultural Production" included Shri C. R. Ranganathan, Shri T. P. Abraham, Dr. S. P. Raychaudary, Dr. R. V. Tamhane, Dr. O. P. Gautham, Dr. D. S. Ranga Rao, Mr. Robert H. Engle, Dr. Vincent Sauchelli, Shri T. R. Chadda, Dr. K. S. Rao, Dr. A. K. Dutt and Dr. S. D. Nijhawan. The participants in the other symposium on "Intensive District Agricultural Programme" were amongst others Mr. A. D. Waker, Dr. J. P. Bhattacharjee, Dr. H. R. Caepner, Shri V. M. Jakhade, Dr. G. R. Seth and Dr. S. D. Srivastava.

A popular lecture on "India's Problem of Hunger and Future Needs in Food Supplies" was delivered by Dr. P. V. Sukhatme. In addition, there were two paper reading sessions in the meeting.

The meeting was organised by a Reception Committee with Dr. V. G. Panse as Chairman.

The International Ore and Fertilizer (India) Ltd. entertained the delegates who attended the meeting, and arranged a tea party for the delegates who attended the meeting.

The General Body of the Society recorded its grateful vote of thanks to the International Ore and Fertilizer (India) Ltd. for the tea party and the Reception Committee for excellent arrangements for holding the Society meeting.

Among the other activities of the Society during the year, special mention may be made of a seminar on "Problems of Cost Studies in Agriculture" which was held at Matheran from 28th October to 4th November, 1960, under the joint auspices of the Indian Society of Agricultural Economics and the Indian Society of Agricultural Statistics in collaboration with the Government of India. The participants included a number of workers and experts in the field from within India as well as Dr. Horring and Yang, two foreign experts, who were deputed by the F.A.O. A report on the seminar has been published. The members of the Society of Agricultural Statistics can purchase this report from the Indian Society of Agricultural Economics at a Cash discount of 25%.

A statement of audited accounts of the Society for the year 1960-61 is placed on the table. The audit has been carried out by Professional auditor as usual.

As in previous years, the Railway authorities agreed to give concession to the members and delegates attending the annual meeting of the Society. The Society records its thanks to the Railway authorities.

The work of the Society during the past year which I have briefly summarised above was made possible through the active help of all the members of the Executive Council of the Society and the guidance and encouragement received from our Executive President, Dr. M. S. Randhawa, I.C.S.

A large number of persons, both in India and abroad, have helped the Society in referring the papers received for publication in its journal. The Society is very much glad to record its thanks to all of them.

The Society is also thankful to Shri T. Prasad, for his help in preparing the Hindi Supplement of the journal.

In the end I have to thank the Secretariat of the Society especially Shri Sada Nand for taking a very keen interest in the work of the Society. Their untiring efforts and devotion is reflected in the smooth and efficient handling of its secretarial work. The Society is glad to record its thanks for the valuable services being rendered by them to the Society.
