GUIDELINES TO AUTHORS FOR SUBMISSION OF PAPERS

Manuscripts must be original contributions and should be submitted exclusively to the Secretary, Indian Society of Agricultural Statistics, IASRI Campus, Library Avenue, New Delhi-110 012 (INDIA).

Three copies are required, typed with double spacing on one side only of A4 sheets with a wide margin (30 mm) on the left-hand side. Manuscripts should not normally come to more than 12 published pages in the journal, and there is a preference for shorter submission.

The papers with a theoretical content should have as far as possible a numerical example illustrating the ideas.

A short summary of about 100 words must be included at the beginning of the manuscript, together with 5 or 6 keywords or phrases to describe the content of the paper. Short title of the paper should be given.

The text should be arranged under sequentially numbered headings; spellings should follow Chambers Dictionary.

The author to whom proofs are to be sent and the full postal address, and an E-mail address if desired, should be clearly stated on the title page. No new material may be introduced at the proof-reading stage.

Illustrations should be in a form suitable for direct reproduction, drawn in Indian ink on drawing paper or generated from a high resolution printer, and should preferably all require the same degree of reduction. Captions should be typed in a separate list. All illustrations (and tables) must be clearly numbered and referred to in the text.

References should be numbered but should be standardised as follows:

- (a) in the text, the authors' surnames only should be given followed by the serial number quoted in parenthesis in the references.
- (b) at the end of the paper, the references should be listed in alphabetical order of surnames with serial number in parenthesis.

Examples for a paper in a journal, a book and a paper presented at a conference are:

Mathematical expressions should be typewritten. Each equation should be typed on a seperate line and numbered consecutively and punctuated in the usual way. Matrix, vector (bold) and script quantities should be identified in the margin where they first occur. The development of mathematical expressions, if necessary, should be presented in appendices with only the relevant equations stated in the main text. The order of brackets in nested expressions is [{ () }].
